How to find syllabus?

*Japanese Language Courses are categorized into seven proficiency classes: ES to E5. ES is for beginner and E5 is advanced.

EXAMPLE:

“Japanese Listening 1” is for beginner. “Japanese Listening 4A” is more advanced than “Japanese Listening 3A”.

STEP 2:

Regarding the Japanese Language Courses, you will be placed into an appropriate language level class in accordance with the result of your placement test.

- 1) Click “Specify Keywords”
- 2) Tick “Search by Name of Subject” and type the name of class
eg: Japanese Reading 4A

Divide by space in order to search including all words or phrases.
Divide by a half-sized font exclamation mark (!) to search with any word or phrases. Insert space before the exclamation mark
Insert a half-sized font hyphen (-) before the word or phrase to exclude a word or phrase
Search will be evaluated from the left.
(Example) Economics Mathematics !Statistics ?Primer ("Economics and Mathematics" or "Statistics" excluding "primer")
(Example) Mathematics !Statistics Economics ?Primer ("Mathematics or Statistics" and "Economics excluding Primer")

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- 3) Click "OK" and "Search"
- 4) You can see the syllabus
