The **ILE: TESOL Program** presents a unique opportunity to study with both faculty and students from a variety of linguistic and cultural backgrounds.

All ILE full-time faculty members have doctoral level degrees and extensive teaching experience in Japan and other countries where English is taught as a foreign or second language.

Due to a small student-faculty ratio (the **ILE: TESOL Program** accepts a maximum of eight applicants each academic semester), ILE faculty members can provide individualized support for each graduate student.

The **ILE: TESOL Program** is a challenging English-medium graduate program where program faculty are committed to supporting students and assisting them as they strive towards their professional and educational goals.

5 The extensive teaching practice under the supervision of an experienced practicum supervisor (totaling approximately 45 hours of classroom instruction and an additional 22 hours of supervisor feedback) is a central component of the overall graduate program.

Upon completion of their Master's degree, graduates of the **ILE: TESOL Program** are eligible to apply for a limited number of Assistant Lecturer positions which are offered to ILE: TESOL graduates through the World Language Center at Soka University.

The ILE: TESOL Program emphasizes the development of a broad understanding of second language acquisition theory and research methods as well as individualized supervision and practical experience.



The ILE: TESOL Program includes four core components that are emphasized throughout students' two years of study:

- Understanding and utilizing learning theory and teaching methodology
- Understanding, utilizing, and conducting research
- Integrating teaching ideas through practical experience
- Specialization through research, practical and professional interests

Based in Japan, the **ILE: TESOL Program** is a rigorous academic program at the graduate level that employs a distinctively Western approach to graduate study, requiring students to actively prepare for and participate in class discussions. Although challenging, the program staff and faculty are dedicated to providing support for students so that they can successfully meet their educational goals and the expectations of the program.

» THE ILE: TESOL ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The ILE: TESOL Program focuses on the following four major areas:

UNDERSTANDING AND UTILIZING LEARNING THEORY AND TEACHING METHODOLOGY

For every teacher, learning theory lays the foundation for how to teach, how to make sense of what occurs in the classroom, and how to help all students achieve their individual goals. Within the **ILE: TESOL Program**, the core courses that provide this foundation include:



- Principles of Second Language Acquisition
- Pragmatics and the Study of Communication
- Second Language Teaching Methodology
- Pedagogical English Grammar
- Sociolinguistics and Education
- Language and Culture in EFL Education
- Syllabus and Curriculum Design

UNDERSTANDING, UTILIZING, AND CONDUCTING RESEARCH

The ability to access, understand, utilize, and conduct research are important skills necessary to become a productive member of the language education profession. To develop these skills, students examine a range of research methods used in TESOL and discuss important historical and relevant current research in all their courses.

INTEGRATING TEACHING IDEAS THROUGH PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE

The practical component plays a major role in the training of our graduates. Students have the opportunity to collaborate and teach a communicative course with an experienced faculty member, including observing, co-teaching, receiving supervision and feedback, and developing content- and level-appropriate activities and lesson plans.

SPECIALIZATION THROUGH RESEARCH, PRACTICAL OR PROFESSIONAL INTERESTS

Practical emphasis

Students can choose a more practice-oriented track during their second year and complete a Teaching and Learning Project in TESOL, including innovative teaching materials and curricula.

Research thesis

Students can choose a research-oriented track, develop a formal research proposal and carry out that research under the supervision of experienced faculty members.



Research paper

Students can take advantage of additional coursework and opt for completing an extensive literature review of a topic of importance in TESOL under the guidance of a ILE faculty member.

Selection of Elective Courses

Students are encouraged to pursue their professional interests through a number of elective courses in order to tailor their studies to best suit their goals as future language educators. The list of available elective courses includes:

- Writing Skills for Graduate Students
- English for Academic/Professional Purposes
- Language Testing and Assessment
- Technology and Second Language Education
- Pedagogical Pronunciation
- English for Secondary Education
