The Silk Road was very important to the story of the Polo family and their journey to China. But the Silk Road was not just one large road. It was a number of different routes, often with smaller roads at the side to places that were good for trade.

One of the most famous Silk Road routes went from Xi'an in eastern China to Kashgar in western China, then through Samarkand in Central Asia and Baghdad in the Middle East, and finished at cities on the Black Sea and the Mediterranean Sea.

The Silk Road began in the second century BC, but of course it did not stay the same over the centuries. Different routes sometimes became more important than others 7 new trade or fighting in some areas.

One surprising thing about the Silk Road is its name. People often think that the name is many hundreds of years old, but this is not true. The German traveller Ferdinand von Richthofen first used the words 'Silk Road' in the nineteenth century to describe the different routes from China to Europe. The name is from the most famous thing to come from China—silk.

Silk was one of the most important trade goods. It was very valuable in Europe and merchants could carry it easily on their horses or camels. Silk was as valuable as gold and traders often used it as money to buy spices or other goods. At this time people made silk 9 beautiful carpets, clothes, shoes, and pictures.

Trade goods were not the only things that came along the Silk Road. Important new ideas and religions moved with people too. Buddhism travelled from India to China along the Silk Road. And people later brought ideas out of China — how to make paper and gunpowder,

Modern tourists can now visit parts of the Silk Road by train, bus, or plane. 11 of course journeys at the time of Marco Polo were a lot slower. Merchants travelled about 40 kilometres on a very good day but under 20 kilometres on a bad day.

Travellers like the Polos often rode on horses or camels. Large Bactrian camels were best when you had to cross high mountains like the Pamirs in Central Asia. These strong animals could live with the sudden changes from hot to cold on those difficult parts of the Silk Road.

After a long day, travellers usually stopped at a caravanserai—a place where travellers could stay. Visitors could find food, drink, and somewhere to sleep there. It was a good place to meet other travellers too, and perhaps find a new caravan to journey with. Merchants also talked late into the night there, and sometimes learned important news about roads or

People sometimes call the human body a machine—the most wonderful one ever built. Of course, the human body is not a machine. But it can be compared to one in many ways. Like a machine, the body is made 17 of many parts. Each part of the body, like each part of a machine, does special jobs. But all the parts work together and so make the body or the machine run smoothly. Also like a machine, the body needs energy to work. In such a machine as an automobile, the energy comes from gasoline. In the body, it comes from food and oxygen.

Although the human body can be compared to a machine, it is far more amazing than any machine. It can do things that no machine can do. For example, the body can grow. The body starts out as one cell. In time, this tiny cell develops into a body consisting of trillions of cells. The human body can also replace certain worn-out parts. Each day, several billion cells in the body die and are replaced by cell division. 19 , the body is always rebuilding itself. Every 35 to 45 days, for instance, the human body replaces the outermost layer of skin.

The human body can defend itself against hundreds of diseases. The body can also repair itself after most small injuries. Many body parts, 20 the heart and kidneys, work continuously. The heart of a 70-year-old person, for example, has pumped about 55 million gallons (208 million liters) of blood during that person's life. The person's kidneys have also removed wastes from more than 1 million gallons (3.8 million liters) of blood.

By using its senses, the body can detect changes in its surroundings, such as changes in temperature, light, or sounds. It can adjust to these changes quickly. The body's senses are truly incredible. For instance, people can learn to identify thousands of odors, 21 smell is one of the least developed senses in human beings. The human body can also detect changes that occur within itself, such as changes in body temperature. The various parts of the body continuously adjust their activities to keep the "inside" environment normal. Such adjustments rely on a system of nerves that carries messages from one part of the body to another. The messages travel at speeds of up to 400 to 425 feet (120 to 130 meters) per second.

The most remarkable part of the human body is the brain. The human brain is so highly developed that it makes people different from all other living things. Their magnificent brain makes people able to think. They can compose silly rhymes or beautiful poetry. They can imagine a dream world or study the mysteries of the atom. No animal—no matter how smart—and no computer—no matter how powerful—can think like a human being.
