

Pilates* is an exercise program that has become popular in recent years. However, it is not a new technique. It was developed during World War I by a man named Joseph Pilates. He had been a student of yoga, martial arts**, skiing, and other physical activities. During the war, he worked with sick or hurt people and used his knowledge of the body to help patients who could not get out of bed become healthy again.

Joseph Pilates actually called his method "contrology." As the name suggests, control is an important part of his technique. His method tries to improve the mind's control over the muscles. As such, movements are slow and exact. Many exercise programs require one to do the same movements over and over at a high speed. Pilates, as it is now known, involves movements that are performed fewer times and at slower speeds. People who do Pilates are also less likely to hurt themselves. It is recommended for people who suffer from back problems.

Doing Pilates increases your strength, flexibility, posture***, balance, and coordination****. Focusing on breathing and thinking about one's body are very important when doing this kind of exercise. Many find the deep breathing and slow movement helpful as more than just exercise. They see Pilates as an exercise of both the body and the mind like yoga, and it is also a great way to reduce stress.

There are two methods in Pilates: one is mat work, and the other utilizes machines. With mat work, you use your own body for weight in building strength. Some classes also include things to exercise with like large rubber bands or balls. This is the most popular form of Pilates. The second way to do Pilates utilizes machines designed by Joseph Pilates. Remember, he was working with patients in hospital beds. So he changed these beds to be exercise machines. Over the years, he designed many machines for contrology.

You can find Pilates instructors at most health clubs. But be careful. Since Pilates has become so popular, a lot of these instructors are trained for only a weekend or for a few days. This is not enough. Joseph Pilates required his students to study with him for two or three years before practicing on their own. It is important that instructors be well trained in the methods because, as with any type of fitness, injury is possible.
